Land trust goal (funding: \$45,991 for support of our 3rd math teacher)

Improve math instruction and interventions in order to increase ACT math scores by 5%. ACT practice opportunities will be provided for students in science, language arts, and reading which will help improve those scores by 5%. Focus is this year's 11th graders

School Success Plan Goals (funding: TSSA funds from state \$42,211)

1) math: 9th grade completion rate increase from 46% to 70% by providing interventions for tier 2 and tier 3 students. Focus on ACT prep and mentor meetings

2) increase the number of students at or above grade level by 10% which =16 students. Focus on tutoring for targeted students.

3) Increase numbers of students volunteering by 20% from last year. Focus on service hours at Whittier or other
